As you clean out your closet or reorganize your household, be sure to keep track of the items you give to charity. It's your job, not the charity's, to report the value of the donation to the Internal Revenue Service.

Tax law now requires that all household items given to a charity must be in good or better condition.

Use the work sheets below to record your contributions and use them when you itemize your deductions. Also, be sure to get a receipt from the charity of your donated goods. The nonprofit won't put a dollar value on this receipt, but it will help you prove that you did indeed donate the property if the IRS later asks.

And if the total of all your contributed property comes to more than \$500, you have to file IRS Form 8283 with your tax return.

Deductible Medical Expenses include the following:

- Abortion (legal)
- Acupuncture
- Adopted child, medical expenses or medical insurance premiums
- Alcoholism, treatment of
- Ambulance
- Animals (guide animals, seeing-eye dogs, etc.)
- Attendant for blind or deaf student
- Autoette (three-wheeled vehicle for the disabled)
- Birth control pills
- Breast reconstructive surgery following mastectomy for cancer treatment
- Capital improvements to home prescribed for long-term care services for the chronically ill for medical reasons (if the improvement increases the home's value, there is no deduction allowed)
- Car with handicap controls or equipped to accommodate passengers in wheelchairs
- Childbirth preparation classes (mother)
- Chiropractors
- Contraceptives, prescriptive Physical examination
- Cosmetic surgery (only for procedures that provide prosthesis due to congenital defect, personal injury, or a disfiguring disease. Medically unnecessary procedures are not deductible.)
- Dental fees, dentures
- Diabetic supplies
- Diapers (disposable), due to severe incontinence
- Doctors Schools to alleviate medical condition
- Drug addiction, treatment for
- Drugs, prescription (including for nicotine withdrawal)
- Dyslexia, language training
- Egg donor costs, including legal fees, Transplant, donor's expenses hospital, transportation
- Eye examination, Glasses, Laser eye surgery to correct vision, Contact lenses, saline solution, and enzyme cleaner
- Fluoride device (on advice of dentist)
- Hearing impaired, Visual Alert system, Hearing aid
- Health club dues (prescribed by physician for Weight reduction to treat obesity or a specific problem directly associated)
- Hospital care, in-patient X-ray, Hospital services
- In vitro fertilization
- Iron lung, oxygen equipment for breathing difficulty
- Insulin
- Laboratory tests and fees, Diagnostic fees
- Lead paint, removal of
- Limbs, artificial
- Lodging for health-related trips (limit of \$50 per night per person)
- Nursing services (including board and meals)
- Obstetrical expenses
- Operations (legal—except unnecessary such as unnecessary cosmetic surgery)
- Optometrists, Orthodontists, Osteopaths
- Orthopedic shoes (excess cost)
- Psychiatric care, Psychologists, Psychotherapists, Psychoanalysts
- Radial keratotomy (corrective eye surgery)
- Retirement home, lifetime medical care
- Sanitarium rest home
- Smoking-cessation programs
- Sterilization operation (legal)
- Therapy equipment
- Telephone, specially equipped for the deaf, Television closed caption decoder for the deaf
- Transportation, essential and primarily for medical reason
- Vasectomy (legal) and reversal of vasectomy
- Wheelchair, Crutches, Reclining chair (cardiac patient)
